Parking Issue

Warwick Rural East Safer Neighbourhood Team has received a number of complaints in relation to inconsiderate/obstructive parking in the vicinity of Cubbington Primary School during school drop-off/collections. At times large vehicles (such as heavy goods vehicles, agricultural vehicles and emergency vehicles) have been unable to travel via New Street due to parked vehicles leaving insufficient access on the road.



PARKING GUIDELINES:

- To provide visibility for other road users you should not park within 10 metres of a junction.
- To allow persons to utilise the footpath without having to enter the road unnecessarily you must not obstruct the footpath and/or drop kerbs.
- Do not park on double-yellow lines without the correct exemption.
- Allow room for traffic flow/emergency vehicles.
- Do not park on private property.

Please park considerately and respect persons in the local community. Should the issue not resolve, motorists may be reported and fined.

The next Warwick Rural East community forum will be held on Wednesday 13 June 2018, 7pm at Eathorpe & Wappenbury village hall. Your local Safer Neighbourhood Team policing priorities will be agreed at the forum. Prior to the forum, members of the public can vote online re their top suggested priority.
