

Geography

Use atlases, globes & maps, identify the equator and tropics of Capricorn and Cancer and learn that the tropical rainforests are situated between the tropics.

Study countries which have rainforests, learning to understand and appreciate what it would be like to live in a rainforest climate.

Learn that rainforests are being destroyed and explore a variety of different causes.

Science

Plant Life – Children will learn the functions of flowering plants. The requirement of growth, water transportation in plants and seed dispersal.

Children will look at keys and understand the classification of plants, animals and micro-organisms.

Chemistry – Children will understand the properties of materials and carry out tests on different groups. Understand states of matter; solid, liquid and gas.

Literacy

Narrative: Write stories inspired by reading across the curriculum (Charlie and the Chocolate Factory), Myths and Legends.

Poetry: Performance poetry

Non-fiction: Information texts, instructions, persuasive writing.

Text Level: To make notes, to re-tell the main points of a story in sequence, to discuss characters, to be able to determine the significant aspects of the text and summarise, to distinguish between 1st and 3rd person and write a 1st person account, to organise work into paragraphs, to compare and evaluate stories, to write powerful openings and extended stories.

Word Level: Identify mis-spelt words in own work. Use dictionaries. To use the terms 'singular' and 'plural' appropriately and to know what happens to the spelling of nouns when -s is added. Recognise and spell common suffixes and to learn the spellings of words ending in: -ous, -tion, -cian, -ssion, -sion. To embed the correct use and spelling of pronouns. To develop knowledge of prefixes to generate new words from root words. Spell unfamiliar words using known conventions and spelling strategies.

Sentence Level: The function of adjectives, verbs, nouns and pronouns within sentences. To understand the function of the comma within sentences. Extend knowledge and understanding of pluralisation. Join sentences in more complex ways. Sentence construction and punctuation through the use of exclamation marks and inverted commas.

Reading

Please continue this term to use the red diaries to record when your child has read. However competent, it is important that they are heard to read whenever possible. Please listen to them read, ask them questions about what they have read and record your comments in their diaries. Thank you.

Numeracy

Compare and order fractions with the same denominator; begin to recognise equivalences of $\frac{1}{2}$; add and subtract fractions with the same denominator.

Multiply numbers between 10 and 30 by 3, 4 and 5 using the grid method; multiply 2-digit numbers by 3, 4, 5 and 8 using the grid method.

Understand division using chunking, with remainders.

Draw and interpret bar charts and pictograms.

Compare and measure weights in multiples of 100g and know how many grams are in a kilogram.

Use column addition to add three 2- and 3-digit numbers together and four 2- and 3-digit numbers together; subtract 3-digit numbers using counting up; solve word problems choosing an appropriate method.

Identify, name and draw horizontal, vertical, perpendicular, parallel and diagonal lines, angles and symmetry in 2D shapes; measure the perimeter of 2D shapes

Tell the time on analogue and digital clocks to the minute, begin to tell the time 5, 10, 20 minutes later, recognise am and pm and 24-hour clock times.

Home Learning..... How you can help

Over this Summer term the children will receive a home learning task related to our second theme 'Vanishing Rainforests'. There will be an extended time given and your child can do extra tasks, reading and research, and will be rewarded for this. You can help by supporting your child to find and select appropriate resources from the library to help them to complete the tasks. The home learning task is to be completed in the Thematic Home Learning Book.

Your child will receive a weekly online maths task during the first half term and a written piece of maths during the second half term; this will be a consolidation of basic number skills or ongoing work covered in class.

They will also have a weekly literacy task to be completed in the Literacy home learning book that will be given out on a Friday to be handed in on Wednesday.

Each child will have a list of 10 spellings to learn every week to be tested on Monday. Spelling lists for each half term will be given out.

If you or your child has any concerns about home learning then please let us know.
