### Pupil premium grant expenditure 2014/15

#### Principles of Spending Pupil Premium Grant

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of pupils;
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups which includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed;
- In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged;
- We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged;
- Pupil premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals. Limited funding and resources mean that not all children receiving free school meals will be in receipt of pupil premium interventions at one time.

#### Summary of PPG spending 2014/15

##### Objectives in spending PPG:

1. Accelerate progress of disadvantaged pupils to at least age related expectations in Literacy and Maths;
2. Provide additional teaching and learning opportunities through trained teaching assistants and external agencies;
3. Provide strategies which raise vulnerable pupils' confidence and self-belief, enabling them to become confident learners and a valued part of the school community.
4. Provide support and guidance for vulnerable pupils and families

##### Summary of spending and actions taken:

- Specific 1:1 and small group support is provided through deployment of 0.6 fte SEN TA3 and subscription to the Round Oak support service.
- TA1 full time support in Year 2 class to support behaviour for learning
- Access to cluster activities particularly for the more able children who are entitled to Pupil Premium;
- Access to advice from the Educational Psychologist;
- 2 hours per week of specialist counselling support;
- Uniform and resources;
- Relax kids program for particular year groups;
