Using the text 'Suffragette: The Battle for Equality' the children will be writing formal letters, diary entries, balanced arguments, speeches and short news reports.

They will study the War of the Roses and analyse sources to discover who Henry VIII was and what his key achievements and failures were. The children will end the topic through analysing whether Mary Tudor deserves the moniker 'bloody' and studying what Elizabeth I looked like.
