Maths

Place Value

Represent numbers to 100, partition numbers to 100, number line to 100, represent and partition numbers to 1,000.

Understand hundreds, tens and one and find 1, 10 or 100 more or less.

Estimate, compare and order numbers to 1,000.

Addition and Subtraction

Add and subtract 10s and 100s. Add 10s across a 100. Add two numbers with no exchange. Add two numbers across 10 and 100.

Subtract 1s and 10s across a 100. Subtract two numbers with no exchange and subtract two numbers across 10 and 100.

Multiplication and Division

Multiplication – find equal groups and use arrays. Find multiples of 2, 5 and 10. Multiply by 3 and 4 and 8. Understand the 3, 4 and 8 times tables.

Division – Understand sharing and grouping. Divide by 3, 4 and 8.

Your child will receive a weekly maths task using www.maths.co.uk set on a Monday; this will be a consolidation of ongoing work covered in class.

Each child will have a list of 10 spellings to learn every week to be tested on Monday. Spelling lists for each half term will be given out. Your child can practise their weekly spellings on Spellshed.

Your child will have a reading book from the KS2 library, we would like your child to complete an Accelerated Reader Quiz to check their understanding of the story before they change their book. All login details will be on their bookmark.
