Geography: We will focus on North America, comparing different regions, biomes and human geographical features. We will also investigate why migration took place in Anglo-Saxons Britain, shaping the political borders of the UK.

Science

Animals including Humans

Forces: the force of gravity acting between the Earth and the falling object; identify the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction, that act between moving surfaces; and finally, they learn how to recognise that some mechanisms including levers, pulleys and gears allow a smaller force to have a greater effect.

English

Our text foci will be: *Beowulf*, the Viking epic poem and translated by Michael Morpurgo, *Robot Girl*, a science fiction story by Malorie Blackman, *The Highwayman*, a narrative poem by Alfred Noyes, and *Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief*, a modern story referencing Greek mythology by Rick Riordan.

Spelling strategies:

- to identify misspelt words in own writing;
- to use known spellings as a basis for spelling other words with similar patterns or related meanings;
- to use independent spelling strategies, including:
- applying knowledge of spelling rules and exceptions;
- building words from other known words, and from awareness of the meaning or derivations of words;
- using dictionaries and IT spell-checks;

Spelling conventions and rules

- learning and inventing spelling rules;
- inventing and using <u>mnemonics</u> for irregular or difficult spellings;
- unstressed vowel spellings in polysyllabic words;
- investigating words with common prefixes, suffixes, roots of words;

Grammar and Punctuation

Adverbs, adverbials, fronted adverbials, encouraged to record colons, bullet points and dashes, descriptive language using powerful adjectives and tenses including past perfect and imperative.

Reading

Year 5 pupils will in general be reading by themselves. They will be encouraged to take Accelerated Reader quizzes on the books read and change their library book regularly in line with their Accelerated Reader levels. Even though they are in Year 5 and are becoming competent readers it is still important that they are heard to read whenever possible.
