Principles of Spending Pupil Premium Grant

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of pupils;
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups which includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed;
- In making provision for socially disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged;
- We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged;
- Pupil premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals. Limited funding and resources mean that not all children receiving free school meals will be in receipt of pupil premium interventions at one time.

Objectives in spending PPG:

1. Accelerate progress of disadvantaged pupils to at least age related expectations in Literacy and Maths;
2. Provide additional teaching and learning opportunities through trained teaching assistants and external agencies;
3. Provide strategies which raise vulnerable pupils' confidence and self-belief, enabling them to become confident learners and a valued part of the school community.
4. Provide support and guidance for vulnerable pupils and families

KS2 TA 3 morning Salary	£12960	Targeted support for learning through intervention provision for Reading, Writing and Numeracy Two full mornings of nurture for children in KS1 and KS2	
KS2 TA 2 Salary	£14320	Support with behaviour for learning including training for these members of staff.	
Booster support for Y6 PP children (TA2)	£2000	To ensure that these children have additional support to make good progress and prepare them for secondary school	
EIS SEN support from a specialist teacher	£3053	Support from EIS specialist teacher for assessments, advice, meetings with staff and parents.	
Weekly 1: 1 Counselling from Snowford Grange	£2200	Provide emotional support and guidance to support pupils with emotional well-being to enable pupils to attain age related expectations.	
Access to cluster activities	£1000	Provide activities for children, particularly the more able children entitled to PP. Provide training for staff via cluster.	
Access to the Educational Psychologist	£2000	Support SENDCO with reports for particular children.	
Feelings group (Nurture) run by a nurture specialist	£1500	Provide emotional support and guidance to support pupils with emotional well-being to enable pupils to attain age related expectations.	
Uniform and Resources	£800	Supporting vulnerable families New initiative to increase uptake of PE kit	
Nurture Group and resources	£2000	Training and CPD for additional member of staff. Ongoing supplies and resources to maintain the group.	
After school clubs	£300	To provide access for children to cookery, football, multiskills, handball and basketball	
Support for families for extended educational visits	£200	25% of visit subsidised for PP families	
Pupil progress meetings	£600	Termly meetings with SLT and class teachers. Specific focus on the progress of pupil premium children
