Dear Parents and Carers,

We have now completed our third week of remote learning and I continue to be impressed with the levels of engagement from your children. There is some incredible learning happening in your homes and I really enjoy looking through Seesaw and seeing what each class is getting up to.

In school we have nearly 30% of our children in keyworker provision. This is organised into four bubbles of children with teaching assistants taking care of the children and guiding them through the work set by the teachers on Seesaw. All teaching assistants and midday supervisors are working their full contracted hours to enable us to staff the four bubbles. This staffing arrangement means that the teachers are able to plan and prepare work for Seesaw, respond to all of their children throughout the day and this week they will be starting some live sessions for children on zoom. We are extremely grateful that we are able to staff our bubbles in this way.

It is important that we keep the numbers of children in the bubbles at school as low as possible so I urge parents using the keyworker facility to only book the days each week that they absolutely cannot manage without. The numbers have grown significantly this week and we will not be able to sustain this level of growth any more. If we have to staff an additional bubble it could mean bringing teaching staff into school which will reduce their contact with children who are at home.

The DfE guidance states that: *Children with at least one parent or carer who is a critical worker can go to school or college if required, but parents and carers should keep their children at home if they can.*

Please bear this in mind when asking for places and when you complete the weekly booking form.

Lateral flow testing for school staff

We are expecting a delivery of lateral flow devices for staff to use at home twice a week. This is optional for staff and they log the results on the testing website and inform school. Many staff have been choosing to go to the community testing facility at Pound lane so this will now be easier for them. I hope that this goes some way to helping staff to feel a bit safer about being in school in the current time. If a member of staff who works with your child tests positive in a lateral flow test we will inform you immediately and we will close the bubble that they are in.

Informing school of Covid cases

Please continue to inform us if your child or someone in your household test positive for Covid-19 even if they are not in school at the moment. The DfE expects us to keep records of all positive cases within our school community.
